Middle and High School costumes must be able to be worn in such a manner that it will not distract or disrupt the educational activities that are otherwise planned for the day. "Scary clown/ creepy clown" masks and costumes will **not** be allowed to be worn or possessed on school grounds.

**You can find it in new locations throughout the building between October 7- October 25!


We are looking for donations of candy to help our Trunk or Treat Event on Halloween from 5-7!
