Supporting other people when they struggle is a critical part of being human. There are many different approaches to helping people who are struggling. These can include listening while they describe an event and their feelings about it, taking action to help people in need, or simply being there and sitting together in silence. Everyone faces tough days and needs support, and this support leads to a chain of prosocial behavior that makes us feel good about ourselves and our group.

As we enter the holiday season, it's important to remember that this time of year can bring a wide range of emotions for our students. While many find joy and excitement in the celebrations, others may experience stress, sadness, or worry.

I encourage you to take some time to discuss with your children the values of kindness, empathy, and compassion. These conversations can help them understand that everyone's experiences are unique and that small acts of kindness can make a big difference. Whether it's including a classmate in a

game, offering a kind word, or simply being a good listener, these moments help create a supportive and understanding community for all.

Thank you for partnering with us to nurture not only your child's education but also their emotional growth. Together, we can ensure that every student feels valued and supported during this season and beyond.
